The meeting was called to order at 8:05pm.

The minutes were deferred to the next meeting.

Tammy reported the following regarding streets:

- Speed signs on 6th Street between Highland and La Brea in both directions will be installed later this month. The Council office has said that
- 6th Street will be repaved sometime in 2020.
- All of Mansfield from the cul de sac to 3rd Street will be repaved with black asphalt. Once it cures, a topcoat of the new “Cool Street” white finish will be applied. This is a pilot. At this time, no timing for other streets in the neighborhood.
- Street lights all over the area have been out. They are old and need to be re-wired. The process is ongoing, but slow.

Tammy also reported on the efforts of herself and the LAPD to reach out to local businesses about homelessness. She and Dave Cordova went to all the local businesses on Wilshire and La Brea that are contiguous to La Brea Hancock. They handed out the attached one-page flier. She reported that most businesses haven't reported any problems. The LAPD reports that violent crime is down.

The homeless count is coming up in January, 23 2020. See the attached handout and resource guide. Tammy encouraged Board members and others in the community to participate.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm.

LA-HOP

Have you seen someone experiencing homelessness who needs help? Noticed a homeless neighbor who seems to be struggling with their physical and/or mental health? In just a few minutes, you can help them by filling out an outreach request at www.la-hop.org
With just a few clicks on a smartphone, tablet, or computer, the Los Angeles Homeless Outreach Portal (LA-HOP) makes it easier to request help for people experiencing homelessness on the streets of Los Angeles.

If you are concerned about illegal activity, contact law enforcement. For all non-emergencies, call 1-877-ASK-LAPD or 911 for medical and mental health emergencies, or when the individual appears to be a danger to themselves or others. For encampments, download the MyLA311 app to make a service request, or call 311. Encourage your neighbors to file the same request (this will help prioritize the area).
